SHOW ENTRY RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **No entries will be accepted for judging after 9:00 pm, Friday, November 13th, 2009.**
Subsequent entries will be exhibited but not judged.
2. Only properly authorized persons will be permitted in the show area during judging.
3. The appropriate class for the intergeneric hybrids shall be the first class for the intergenetic crosses which lists one of the genera making up the hybrid.
(See lists of genera belonging in each class at the registration desk).
4. Any plant can be entered in one of classes 10 – 112 and in class 114.
5. In the event the exhibitor of cut flowers cannot be present, the Show Committee will display the material to the best advantage.
6. There are no fees to the exhibitor for entries or assistance in the preparation of exhibits.
7. If the return of materials is required, it will be returned at the exhibitor's expense. All exhibits not claimed by the exhibitor by 5:30 Sunday, or the disposal of which has not been specified, will be distributed by the Show Committee.

9. Neither the CAW Hall or the Niagara Region Orchid Society or any of its members or volunteers is responsible for the loss or damage of any plants, blooms or corsages, containers, equipment or other property of vendors and or exhibitors. However, every precaution will be exercised for their safety.

10. Banquet tables will be furnished without cost in the display area. However, back curtains, cloths, foliage plants, etc must be furnished by the exhibitor.
11. Foliage plants, moss, etc. may supplement exhibits, but no artificial plants or foliage may be used. Artificial grass may not be used as a ground covering. **Orchids are to be the only flowering plants in the displays.** When corsages or floral arrangements are displayed, **orchids must be the dominant flower.**
12. Any lighting used for effect is the responsibility of, and must be furnished by, the exhibitor and must be coordinated by the staging committee. Effect lighting may be turned off during judging.
13. All cards displaying exhibitor's names will be provided by the show committee. No other signs will be permitted.
14. Reasonable effort will be made to provide the amount of space requested, but should the space available be less than expected, the **Show Committee reserves the right to limit the space allocated to any exhibitor.**
15. All plants and cut flowers to be considered for judging must be officially entered by class with the Entry Committee. Cut flowers and flowering plants will be considered equally in judging.
16. Judges and clerks are expected to familiarize themselves with the rules and regulations.
17. All plants, cut flowers, photographs and artwork exhibited for competition must be properly labeled without the name of the owner until judging is complete. No dyed or touched up flowers will be permitted.
18. Each competitor agrees, upon making an entry, **to abide by the rules and regulations of the show.**
19. First, second and third place ribbons may be awarded in each class at the discretion of the judges. Trophies will be awarded as designated. Judges have the authority to award or withhold any ribbon or trophy and may sub-divide any class. All NROS trophies must be returned at or before the next years show to the show chairperson.

20. All questions regarding the interpretation or application of the rules shall be referred to the Show Chairperson. **His/her decision will be final.**
21. **No part of an exhibit or Vendor selling area shall be removed until 5:00 pm, Sunday November 15th, 2009.**
22. All shipments of plants, cut flowers or exhibit materials to be displayed for the exhibitor by the Niagara Region Orchid Society must be received no later than 7 pm, Thursday November 12th, 2009. These materials must be prearranged and shipped to: Nancy Vandenberg (See above address).
23. Entries not in accordance with the schedule will be disqualified, and the Show Committee reserves the right to remove all inferior exhibits or any part of them.
24. All entry tags will be removed (by the show committee) from all exhibits when judging is complete.
25. No sales tables shall be allowed in the exhibit area. Any plants or artwork, sold which are parts of an exhibit, shall not be removed from the exhibit before the show is closed at 5cl on Sunday.
26. Plant Vendors must place a quality exhibit in the show with a minimum of 10 flowering orchid plants. Artist/photographer vendors must enter a minimum of 4 framed pictures in the show. Unsatisfactory vendor displays will result in removal of the display and Vendor's sales tables at the discretion of the Show chair.
27. Entries may be emailed in ADVANCE to the Show Registrar at: rusztyns@iaw.on.ca BEFORE 10 pm Thursday November 12th, 2009. Please use the form available on our website! It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to make sure that all entries are in their proper classes.
28. **All plant vendors must enter the Commercial class for their display.**
